<p>Sustainability</p>	<p>To secure lasting benefits from our PE & Sport Premium investments, we have focused on ensuring all children have access to quality first teaching and additional opportunities to compete or participate in external sporting opportunities (including children that are SEN or PP). These measures ensure high-quality PE delivery continues beyond the funded year.</p> <p>Examples of practice include:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Structured lunch-time and after-school activity clubs

	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> - All teachers have supported external competitions across the year highlighting improvement in teacher confidence and participation. - All PP children in KS2 participated in at least one after school competition. - ALL SEN children in KS2 were provided access to additional sporting clubs which promoted inclusion and participation in sporting activities. - PE equipment (e.g., multi-skill kits, field marking tools, outdoor storage) was purchased with durability in mind to support future cohorts. - Our Subject Lead participates in local networks to share best practice and access ongoing training.
