| Impact of PE and Sports Grant 2016/17 | |
| <p>The PE and Sports funding has contributed to the provision of high quality PE and sport at Great Bowden Academy. Pupils' levels of physical activity have increased and performance in local sporting competitions has improved enormously. The school has been successful in the Small Schools Football League, winning the Small Schools Football trophy in 2015, The Sid East Football Tournament in 2015 and the local small schools Netball Tournament. Pupils also achieved high rankings in local primary athletics meetings. This success has also had an impact on levels of self-confidence and self-esteem for all pupils, which contributes, in turn, to improving levels of achievement across the curriculum.</p> | |
